NOTICE OF FIVE-YEAR REVIEW JEFFERSON BARRACKS FORMER POST DUMPING GROUNDS

The U.S. Army is initiating the first Five-Year Review (FYR) for the Jefferson Barracks Former Post Dumping Grounds Site. The Jefferson Barracks was established in 1826 as a garrison for the U.S. Army infantry units. From 1826 to 1946, portions of the Jefferson Barracks riverfront property were used for various waste disposal activities, including World War I-era military munitions, such as mortar rounds. The FYR is being conducted to meet the requirements of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980. It will evaluate the implementation and performance of the site remedy to determine if it remains protective of human health and the environment.

The selected remedy for the Site, which was implemented in 1999, includes land use controls consisting of the installation of riprap (riprap is a material consisting of stone or crushed rock, which is placed along shorelines to protect against erosion) at the former dump area and posting of warning signs.

The FYR Report will be reviewed by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources. It will also be made available to the public after finalization in December 2021.
